



REGISTRATION NOTICE FOR THE CLINICAL SIMULATION TOURNAMENT I INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS ON EMERGENCIES AND CLINICAL SIMULATION OF THE FACULTY OF MEDICAL SCIENCES OF MINAS GERAIS (*FACULDADE CIÊNCIAS MÉDICAS DE MINAS GERAIS*)

The Organizing Committee of the International Congress on Emergencies and Clinical Simulation (CIESC), affiliated with the Faculty of Medical Sciences of Minas Gerais, announces the opening of registrations for the CIESC tournaments, to be held on October 20, 25, 27, and 28, 2025.

1. FROM THE DEFINITION:

The Clinical Simulation Tournament is an innovative and pioneering event at the Faculty of Medical Sciences of Minas Gerais (FCMMG). It integrates two fundamental approaches: realistic simulation, which, as an essential tool in contemporary health education, recreates patient care scenarios in critical situations, providing practical and immersive learning for health students; and academic competition, which, in a challenging and collaborative environment, stimulates active learning by assessing the clinical reasoning and rapid response capabilities of participants, who will compete for a prize of R\$5,000.00.

2. FROM THE OBJECTIVE:

The main objective of the Clinical Simulation Tournament is to go beyond the application of care protocols, providing health students with a unique opportunity for self-assessment of their readiness to manage critical patients. Participants will be able to identify and enhance their technical skills, essential for doctors, physiotherapists, and nurses, as well as their interpersonal competencies crucial for effective communication and leadership development.

3. REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION:

3.1. Individual Requirements to Participate in the Tournament:

- 3.1.1.** Be a regularly enrolled student in an undergraduate program in Medicine, Physiotherapy, or Nursing at an institution of higher education.
- 3.1.2.** Be properly registered for the International Congress on Emergencies and Clinical Simulation (CIESC).

3.2. Team Requirements:

- 3.2.1.** Registrations are limited to a maximum of 16 (sixteen) teams, each consisting of 6 (six) to 10 (ten) members. Once registered, the composition of the team cannot be altered, and the presence of 100% of the members is mandatory at all stages of the competition. The absence of any team member will result in the disqualification of the team.



3.2.2. Teams must be formed by participants from at least two (2) different academic periods.

3.2.3. The inclusion of at least one (1) student from the Medicine course is mandatory for each team.

3.3 Recommendations and Additional Benefits for Teams:

3.3.1. Teams composed of participants from two (2) or more different courses will receive a 10% bonus on the total score obtained in each stage of the competition.

3.3.2. It is recommended that each group member assume specific and distinct roles, which may be reallocated after the completion of each phase of the Tournament. Such roles may include, for example: leader, person responsible for patient ventilation, person responsible for patient medication, person responsible for defibrillation and monitoring, individuals responsible for cardiopulmonary resuscitation maneuvers (2 members), and person responsible for note-taking.

4. ABOUT THE STRUCTURE OF THE TOURNAMENT:

4.1. Participants must wear long-sleeved lab coats or the LabSim uniform from FCMMG during the tournament.

4.2. The tournament consists of four (4) in-person stages, each with a maximum duration of 40 minutes.

4.2.1. Stage 1 - FIFA: Date to be announced on social media. This stage will take place at a surprise location outside of FCMMG.

4.2.2. Stage 2 - Hollywood: Scheduled for October 20, 2025, at the facilities of FCMMG.

4.2.3. Stage 3 - Labsim (Quarterfinals and Semifinals): Scheduled for October 25, 2025, at the Skills and Realistic Simulation Laboratory of FCMMG.

4.2.4. Stage 4 - Final Challenge: The final will take place on October 28, 2025.

4.3. The clinical competencies and skills of the participants will be assessed through performance checklists.

5. REGARDING REGISTRATIONS:

5.1. Registration Period and Method: The registration period for the tournaments will be from August 9, 2025, to September 2, 2025.



5.1.1 Registrations will be conducted exclusively through the electronic form available at the following address: https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSe9mHtS4b_9eBR9ipQBY0TW/W4e58lwXu1dRaoch8bO7f4ryMQ/viewform?usp=header

5.1.2. The number of registrations is limited to 16 (sixteen) teams. If all spots are filled before the final deadline, registrations may close early.

5.1.3. Only one member per team should complete and submit the registration form. After submission, the organizing committee will send a confirmation email and acknowledgment of the registration within 24 hours.

.5.2. Selection Criteria and Spots:

5.2.1. Team selection will occur on a first-come, first-served basis until the limit of 16 (sixteen) teams is reached.

5.2.2. Waiting List: Teams that register after the 16 spots are filled will be automatically placed on a waiting list, in the order of registration. In the event of a withdrawal from a selected team, the organizing committee may call teams from the waiting list, contacting them up to 24 hours before the start of the tournament.

5.3. Participant and Team Requirements:

5.3.1. All team members must be pre-registered for the International Congress on Emergency and Clinical Simulation (CIEESC).

5.3.2 Teams must be composed of students from different semesters of their courses and may include participants from different universities.

5.4. Announcement of Results and Confirmation:

5.4.1 The official announcement of the participating teams will be made publicly on **September 8, 2025**.

5.4.2 Teams qualified for the subsequent stages of the tournament will be notified by email, using the address registered in the registration form. Failure to respond within the established deadline will result in disqualification.

5.4.3. After the completion of the FIFA stage, the approved participants for the Hollywood stage will be announced, along with the waiting list for the same stage, on October 13, 2025. The deadline for confirming registration will be sent to the emails of the approved teams.



6. ON THE VALUE AND PAYMENT OF REGISTRATIONS:

6.1 FIFA:

6.1.1. Each participant must pay a fee of R\$10.00.

6.1.2. The payment must be made in the name of the team, and the receipt with the total amount (sum of the number of members) must be attached to the registration form.

6.1.3. Example: for a team with 8 members, the total amount will be R\$ 80.00.

6.1.4. The registration will only be considered valid after the correct submission of the receipt.

6.2 Hollywood Phase

6.2.1. The teams qualified in the FIFA Phase must confirm their participation in the Hollywood Phase by paying R\$15.00 per member.

6.2.2. The link to the confirmation form will be sent by email to the qualified teams.

6.2.3. The payment must be made between October 13 and 16, 2025, and the receipt must be sent via the form within this timeframe.

6.2.4. Failure to make the payment or incorrect submission of the receipt will result in the disqualification of the team and the calling of the next team on the waiting list, according to the order of placement.

6.3 LabSim Phases (Stages 1, 2, and 3) and Final Challenge

6.3.1. The 8 teams qualified in the Hollywood Phase must pay a fee of R\$15.00 per member to participate in the LabSim Stages and the Final Challenge.

6.3.2. The confirmation form, along with the link to submit the proof of payment, will be sent by email after the announcement of the qualified teams.

6.3.3. Specific instructions regarding the payment deadline and submission of the receipt will be detailed in the email.

6.3.4. Failure to meet these requirements by the specified deadline will result in the replacement of the team with another from the waiting list, respecting the order of ranking.




7. ABOUT THE CONFINEMENT

The teams will wait for their respective round confined in a separate room. Students must bring their own snacks on the day of the tournament. The following guidelines must be followed: Beverages should be in a transparent bottle, and food (cookies, cereal bars) in transparent containers or zip-lock bags. **BRING YOUR TRANSPARENT WATER BOTTLE!** The entry of notebooks, books, and physical handouts will be allowed. The entry of **ELECTRONIC DEVICES** – WATCHES, CELL PHONES, LAPTOPS, AND OTHERS – will not be approved. If any participant is found with electronic devices, even if turned off, the group will be disqualified. The use of electronic devices is not permitted during confinement, only food and notes.

8. LOCATION AND DATE

The competition will be divided into three main phases, each with a specific schedule, structure, and location.





8.1 FIFA Phase

8.1.1. The FIFA Phase will take place in the first half of September, with the time to be determined and a surprise location. Sixteen teams will participate, with up to 10 members each.

8.1.2. Teams must arrive by their own means for registration and will be taken to the confinement by the organization, with locations yet to be announced.

8.1.3. The theoretical stage will consist of a theoretical-clinical questionnaire answered in groups, with a maximum time of 10 minutes.

8.1.4. In the practical stage, teams will be taken to an external location to carry out a medical emergency simulation. They must organize themselves and execute the care, simulating the role of each member.

8.1.5. The evaluations of the practical stage will be conducted by professors from FCMMG and evaluators from the organizing team of CIESC.

8.1.6. Teams in default will be replaced by surplus teams. The top ten ranked teams will advance to the next phase.

8.2. Hollywood Phase

8.2.1. Scheduled for October 20 at 7 PM, the Hollywood Phase will take place in the Auditorium of Unit 1 at FCMMG, with the participation of 10 teams.

8.2.2. The registration will take place at the entrance of the Auditorium of Unit 1 at FCMMG.

8.2.3. Three videos simulating different clinical situations will be shown. After each video, there will be three questions to be answered by the teams in up to three minutes, using an interactive platform.

8.2.4. The total score will determine the eight teams qualified for the next stage in LabSim.

8.3 LabSim Phases

8.3.1. Stages 1, 2, and 3 will take place on October 25, 2025, from 1 PM to 4 PM, at LabSim at FCMMG. The final will be held on October 28, 2025, at 8:30 PM.



8.3.2. Eight teams will participate. Registration and confinement will take place in a room on the first floor of Unit 1. Students must arrive at least 30 minutes in advance. Students arriving after 12:30 PM will not be able to participate in the competition on October 25, 2025. Students arriving after 8 PM on October 28, 2025, will not be able to participate in the competition.

8.3.3. In this phase, the teams will participate in three practical stations with simulations of distinct clinical emergencies, evaluated based on technical and behavioral criteria.

8.3.4 Stage 1 – Qualifying Round

- Two simulations will be conducted per round, with the order of participation determined by the score obtained in the Hollywood Phase.
- Teams that do not participate in the initial round will remain confined. Each simulation will have a maximum duration of 40 minutes per team.
- At the end of the last round, there will be a 10-minute break for a debriefing with the teams.

8.3.5 Stage 2 – Quarterfinals

- This stage will feature eight teams. The matches will follow the following order, based on the ranking from the previous stage:
 - 1st place vs. 8th place
 - 2nd place vs. 7th place
 - 3rd place vs. 6th place
 - 4th place vs. 5th place
- The level of difficulty will be higher compared to the previous stage, requiring greater technical knowledge and teamwork.
- The maximum duration for each simulation will be 40 minutes. The defeated teams will be eliminated.

8.3.3 Stage 3 – Semifinal



- In this stage, the remaining four teams will compete in the following order:
 - 1st place vs. 4th place
 - 2nd place vs. 3rd place
- The maximum duration expected for each simulation will be 40 minutes.

8.4 Final Challenge Phase

8.4.1. The final phase will be contested by the two winning teams from the semifinal on October 28, 2025, at 8:30 PM, at FCMMG.

8.4.2. The simulation will last a maximum of 30 minutes.

8.4.3. The winning team will receive a cash prize of R\$5,000.00 (five thousand reais). The second place will be awarded a cash prize of R\$1,000.00 (one thousand reais).

9. ABOUT THE EVALUATION DURING THE LABSIM PHASE AND FINAL CHALLENGE:

9.1. The teams will be evaluated at each stage by a group of three instructors/professors.

9.2. The evaluators will have access to a system containing the scored items for each case, that is, the mandatory actions in managing that patient.

9.3. The evaluator must individually indicate whether a specific requirement has been met or not.

9.4. At the end of the case, the average score given by each instructor will be calculated to obtain the team's final grade.

9.5. The team with the highest score in its group will proceed in the competition.

9.6. The performance of orotracheal intubation will not be required, meaning it will not be scored.

10. ABOUT THE AWARDING AND CERTIFICATION



10.1. The team that comes in first place will receive a cash prize of R\$5,000.00 (five thousand reais). Additionally, the team will receive a medal.

10.2. The second place will be awarded a cash prize of R\$1,000.00 (one thousand reais) and a medal.

10.3. All participants in the tournament will receive certificates for their participation, based on the number of stages completed by each team. The certificate will be for 8 hours for those who participated in only 1 stage, 12 hours for 2 stages, and 16 hours for all stages completed.

11. ABOUT THE DISQUALIFYING ACTIONS OF THE TEAM

11.1. Use of any electronic devices in the confinement room.

11.2. Wearing inappropriate clothing, that is, not wearing a long-sleeved lab coat or the LabSim's designated uniform.

11.3. Any attempts to communicate with the outside world during the confinement period.

11.4. Causing irreversible damage to the simulators.

11.5. Any attempts to unfairly proceed in the competition by cheating and harming another team, among others.

11.6. Failure to pay the fees within the deadline.
